PRESERVING OUR LEGACY

To make our vision possible, we must undertake critical renovations to ensure that our parish receives the care it deserves. This involves ensuring our facilities are accessible to all by conducting urgently needed deferred maintenance. Now is the time for us to improve access, make repairs, and replace inefficient systems:



ACCESS

Replace the concrete around the church, ensuring access to all parishioners regardless of ability.



REPAIR

Repair the church steeple's consistent leak to prevent potential injuries.



REPLACE


Replace the boiler in Schafer Hall to improve air quality and ensure the building better serves the needs of the parish.



Estimated costs for repairs and maintenance:

(Please note the final numbers are under review and subject to change)

Replace the concrete around church, ensuring equal accessibility	\$100,000
Repair the church steeple	\$50,000
Replace the boiler in Schafer Hall, renovate Schafer Hall to become a flexible meeting space	\$150,000
Total estimated costs:	\$300,000




SECURING OUR FUTURE

Our Vision is:


To construct a new parish hall that houses a gymnasium/cafeteria that better accommodates the growing St. Mark community and can act as a revenue generator.	\$2,500,000
To build a new parish offices that offer additional meeting spaces for our numerous ministries. To build two additional classrooms to house our growing school community and create optimal learning environments for our youngest parishioners.	\$1,000,000
Funding the St. Mark endowment	\$350,000


